A senior American congressman has dismissed the evidence of BP chief executive Tony Hayward as 'unacceptable' and has promised to continue demanding answers in connection with a huge oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico. Passage 3

Rare and beautiful animals such as the clouded leopard or douc langur monkey spend their lives in the jungles of southeast Asia. In death, they might end up in, of all places, an open U.S. market catering to southeast Asian immigrants. At one such market in Minnesota, in the shadow of the state capitol, federal agents recently uncovered a tiny slice of a multi-billion-dollar criminal enterprise that is rarely seen.

"Slow loris is a primate," said federal agent Sheila O'Connor, explaining photos of evidence confiscated from the market. "These are dholes, dhole hide. These are tapir feet. [A dhole is a member of the dog family; the tapir is an endangered relative of the rhino]. These are douc langur parts. These are hands and feet both." U.S. Fish and Wildlife agents say illegal trafficking in wildlife is the No. 1 threat of extinction for animals ranging from elephants to tigers.

Minneapolis airport inspector Linda Benson ran smack into the strange underworld during a routine check of passengers disembarking from a flight from Laos. "When we found the primate and the elephant skin and the elephant teeth, um, you know, we knew we were on to something," Benson said.

Re: Proposals for mandatory service hours in order to graduate from high school

I am an active participant in the high school service program, and chairperson of a tutoring program run primarily by high school students such as myself. Volunteering is a personal choice and an extracurricular activity such as the debate team or school-sponsored sports.

First, many students do volunteer, and most do it with full force. By the time a volunteering student becomes a senior, that student could earn as many as 1000+ service hours. If an entering freshman is told that he or she must volunteer for a pre-set number of hours, the student might become resentful, complete the required hours, and never volunteer again. The volunteered hours would end up being less than the hours being volunteered now.

Many students do not have the time to volunteer. School goes from a set starting time to a set ending time. If the student's busy after-school schedule does not allow for extracurricular activities, that is the student's own business. With the exception of homework, there is nothing that a student is required to do after school hours.

Finally, mandatory volunteering is an oxymoron. If students are required to volunteer, it is no longer volunteering. The performed service becomes one more thing to do in order to graduate from high school. The quality of work can suffer greatly. If a student enjoys volunteering, he or she will volunteer without having to be told.
